





Enter the campus off State College Boulevard at Student Union Way. Make an immediate left and continue to the State College Parking Structure.





Lisa See is an American writer and novelist. Her books include *On Gold Mountain: The One-Hundred-Year Odyssey of My Chinese-American Family*. The novels *Peony in Love* and *Shanghai Girls* made the *New York Times* best-seller list. See's most recent novel, *The Island of Sea Women*, is a story about female friendship and family secrets. The book "...introduces readers to the fierce and unforgettable female divers of Jeju Island—and the dramatic history spanning from the 1930s to post Korean War—that shaped their lives." (*New York Times*)

Rachel Howzell Hall

Rachel Howzell Hall's thrilling stand-alone novel, *They All Fall Down*, brings seven sinners to a private island for a reckoning that will leave you breathless. "An intense, feverish novel with riveting plot twists." (Sara Paretsky) Hall is the author of the acclaimed Lou Norton series, and the co-author of *The Good Sister* with James Patterson, which was included in the *New York Times* bestseller *The Family Lawyer*. She is on the board of directors for Mystery Writers of America.

Christina Lauren

Christina Lauren is the combined pen name of writing partners and best friends Christina Hobbs and Lauren Billings. The coauthor duo writes both contemporary young adult and adult fiction, and has produced 15 *New York Times* bestselling novels. Together they have made a serious impact on the young adult literary industry, as well as the adult fiction category. From the "hilarious, zany, and heartfelt" (*Booklist*) Christina Lauren comes a romantic comedy, *The Honey-Don't List*, that proves if it's broke, you might as well fix it.

Kate Quinn

Kate Quinn is the author of historical novels. *The Alice Network*, set during WWI, "...offers courageous heroines, villains you love to hate, and dramatic life-or-death stakes." (*Library Journal*) *Ribbons of Scarlet* is a timely story of the power of women to start a revolution—and change the world. In late eighteenth-century France, women do not have a place in politics. But as the tide of revolution rises, women from gilded salons to the streets of Paris decide otherwise—upending a world order that has long oppressed them.

Keith Scribner

Keith Scribner's *Old Newgate Road* is a masterful portrait of a haunted family struggling against often violent impulses to truly know one another... and to come to terms with themselves. "(The) narrative draws on themes of masculinity and sublimated trauma...speaking to the ways people fashion (storylines) out of troubled pasts to survive." (*Publishers Weekly*) Awarded both the Wallace Stegner and John L'Heureux Fellowships in Fiction at Stanford University, Scribner taught in its Creative Writing Program. His provocative first novel, *The Good Life*, is a perceptive comment on the American Dream's criminal edge.

Lynn Vincent

Lynn Vincent, American writer, journalist, and author or co-author of 11 books, focuses on memoirs, politics, and current events. Called "Enthralling" by *Kirkus Reviews*, *INDIANAPOLIS: The True Story of the Worst Sea Disaster in U.S. Navy History and the Fifty-Year Fight to Exonerate an Innocent Man* is a human drama unlike any other—the riveting and definitive story of the worst sea disaster in US naval history. Among Lynn's other books is *Heaven is for Real* (with Todd Burpo), made into a film starring Greg Kinnear.

Salina Yoon

Since **Salina Yoon** appeared at our 2015 *A Day of Authors*, she has continued to win awards including the prestigious 2018 Geisel Honor Book for *My Kite is Stuck*. Yoon is author, illustrator, and format designer of dozens of picture books and early readers, and nearly 200 innovative novelty books for young readers. Her Penguin and Bear and Floppy book series have sold around the world. *Kiki and Jax, the Life-Changing Magic of Friendship*, that she co-authored and illustrated with tidying expert, Marie Kondo, is her latest picture book.
